


Provides analytics/dashboards on multiple city services

Idea of a Hackathon

- 1) City to be a catalyst to align goals of government, corporates, and startup ecosystem
- 2) Create more synergies to problem solve together
- 3) Hack helps to spark ideas, fuel innovation, create technologies
- Foster an environment to allow technologies to scale in Cincinnati, creating jobs, driving revenue and investment while problem solving real government challenges
- 5) Create an innovation template with a public/private partnership that allows the city to hack on a regular basis view the city as a lab to create prototypes and beta tests

Process: Multi-path solutioning

 - Policy Hack:

- Sustainability advocates / civic leaders
- Creating realistic and innovative policy changes that support communities, consumer behavior change,
